PROVINCIAL SHELTER 'DAY IN THE LIFE' STATISTICS SUPPORTED BY YWCA EMERGENCY SHELTER DATA

Calgary, AB – Shelters for women fleeing family violence remain consistently full and women are staying longer according to data released today by a provincial association of shelters and the YWCA of Calgary.

On November 6, 2013, Alberta's women's shelters recorded the number of women and children supported for the annual 'day in the life' count. On that day, 41 of Alberta's family violence shelters served 926 women and 1,102 children. On that same day, 99 women and 97 children could not be accommodated.

At the YWCA Sheriff King Home emergency shelter, longer stays for women fleeing violence is quite evident. In 2012 the average length of stay at the shelter was 20 days and in 2013 the average length of stay was 24 days, an increase of 20 per cent. Last night, the shelter provided beds for 18 women and 22 children.

"It is becoming more and more critical for us to prioritize women based on risk assessments to determine who truly needs to be in shelter and who can be helped in other ways," said Cynthia Wild, Director, Client Services for the YWCA.

The YWCA is consistently full, in both our emergency shelter and transitional housing programs. Occasionally women fleeing violence are able to access other options the YWCA has to offer, when their risk assessment does not require the high level security of a shelter. However, lack of affordable housing in the community for women at risk is compounding the issue and lessening the chance for women to find safe and appropriate housing.
