Voted one of Maclean's Top 100 Charities of 2020, YW provides preventive and restorative services to women and their families to help them thrive. YW is committed to support people experiencing domestic violence, advocating for mental health, and enabling women's economic prosperity.

The Awake Overnight Women's Support Worker is responsible for providing late night and overnight support to women and their children residing in our emergency domestic violence shelter. This position works from a trauma-informed and strengths-based, woman-centered, feminist and non-judgmental perspective to provide support and advice to women.

WHAT MOVES YOU

- You get fulfillment from celebrating small wins and staying positive, knowing it will lead to change
- Affecting positive change by offering inclusive, non-judgmental low barrier services for women
- You approach your work and others through the lens of equity, diversity and inclusivity
- Your commitment to feminist principles and values

WHAT YOU'LL DO

- Provide support and crisis intervention for women and children shelter residents who have experienced violence and homelessness.
- Answer all calls on 24-hour crisis line, screen potential residents and support transition.
- Monitor security cameras and secure entrances to ensure safety and assist supportive housing.
- Conduct intake with residents, including risk assessment and safety planning.
- Provide move-in and move-out room checks with residents as required.
- Build and maintain positive, supportive, non-judgmental and respectful resident relations
- Enter and maintain resident information in electronic and physical files.
- Review key worker case notes and service plans to ensure awareness of needs if overnight support is required.
- Keep accurate records, ensure data entry is completed on time and according to organizational, and program standards.
- ***This position works 24 hours a week and works Tuesdays to Thursdays, 11:00pm – 7:30 am***

WHAT YOU'VE DONE

- Bachelor of Social Work or equivalent in human services field
- Two years' experience working in the field of violence against women
- Working knowledge of the causes and consequences of domestic violence.
- Experience in intake, risk assessment and safety planning is an asset
- Current CPR and First Aid certification
- Working knowledge of crisis intervention, causes and consequences of domestic abuse
- Strong computer literacy including MS Office and able to learn software quickly
- Brain story, ASIST, NVC Training and Food Safe Certification is an asset, or to be completed within 3 to 6 months of employment
- Experience working in a multidisciplinary team is an asset.
- Competence in the completion of case notes and other documentation is required.

As a condition of employment, YW Calgary requires the successful candidate to be fully vaccinated. Where the candidate has not obtained the vaccine, the candidate will be considered on an exceptional case by case basis; YW Calgary will adhere with its obligations under the Alberta Human Rights Act."
