The Clinical Supervisor of the Counselling and Personal Development (CPD) program works with the Manager to provide effective counselling services. This role supervises and promotes the clinical capacity of the counselling team and promotes clinical practice aligned with the principles of the YW Practice Framework. Under the direction of the Program Manager, this role also contributes to the program development and evaluation.

In this position, you must be able to travel to meetings with program partners and funders that may be in the community or at other YW locations as well as support the team to take organizational theory and frameworks and translate them into day-to-day work and practices.

- Opportunity to model clinical work with clients, including crisis intervention and safety planning

- Provide clinical supervision, including providing consultation around clinical and ethical issues.
- Oversee program operations and clinical services such as assessment, treatment, and evaluation.
- Provide administrative supervision including caseload management, documentation, reporting, and other related issues.
- Work collaboratively with community partners towards effective coordination of service for clients.
- Provide direct clinical work with clients, including crisis intervention, safety planning and group facilitation.
- Ensure quality counselling experience to individuals, children and families.
- Participate in the program development, team member recruitment and orientation.
- Provide regular and timely updates regarding team's situations, opportunities or emerging issues.
- Participate in the on-call system and routinely audit client files for quality and adherence to policy.
- ***This role is a 30 hour per week position that involves working some evenings***

WHAT YOU'VE DONE

- Graduate degree in Psychology, Counselling or Social Work with specialization in clinical practice.
- At least three years of successful track record of clinical supervisory experience
- Registration with appropriate professional body
- Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) and First Aid training
- Experience with women, children and families who have experienced domestic violence.
- Experience with individual, group, and family interventions.
- Advanced level understanding of mental health and impacts of abuse, violence, and trauma on people across the lifespan.
- Training and experience in treatment options such as CBT, DBT, Mind/Body therapies.
- Create an environment of trust, respect, creativity, and safety for clinical growth and excellence.

As a condition of employment, YW Calgary requires the successful candidate to be fully vaccinated.
